The Academy of Sex & Relationships

Housed in the Trocadero Centre in the heart of London's Piccadilly Circus - Amora – The Academy for Sex and Relationships' is now open. Association Co-founder Christopher John Ball acted as an arts adviser to this project and the result of this is that several Association members are exhibiting within the Amora's arts sections.

Though Chris sometimes found working on this project a frustrating experience at times, as did some of the artists involved, the final result was certainly worth it. The artworks look great and are well presented - as can be seen from the photographs - in fact it can be argued that the artworks on display are the highlights of the visitor experience and those who participated should feel proud of the work they put in.

Described as "a unique and powerful sensory experience" that attempts to combine entertainment and education -Amora has seven interactive zones that cover every aspect of human relationships. From the first tentative flirtations and dating, through to fantasy and fetish and taking in sexual health and wellbeing along the way.

Using interactive displays the Academy attempts to explore and explain sexual behavior and aims to encourage a deeper understanding of love, sex and relationships.













The artworks are displayed within various sections. The Fetish Wall sees the work of China Hamilton, Hector Heathwood, Robert Babylon and Paul Alexander prominently displayed. I have always seen art as an expression of feeling. I got into fine art modeling because I've always had a passion for the human female form and a passion for fine art. I see Fine and Erotic Art as an amazingly sensual expression of self!

The ability and discipline required to hold a pose which is then transformed via the camera and photographer into an amazing and sometimes mind, boggling piece of visualization is awe inspiring, especially photographers who specialize in using natural light.

As a published fine art model i chose to make modeling a career and was in no illusion how difficult it would be to gain my dream. I was delighted when asked to become one of the associations model members, as an association model i hope to collaborate with as many of my fellow association members as possible in the future.

I'm always excited about creating amazing imagery, It is always good to create a fantasy that comes to life as 'art', so that in itself coupled with the fact that expression and sensuality go hand in hand makes for great art.


When collaborating with an artist who knows exactly what they want, the concept, the vision in their heads, well to me that's an incredibly amazing thing to be a part of.

The camera stops being this intrusive piece of equipment, and instead, at least for me, becomes a window to my views, my emotions, everything that I'm feeling at that given moment is captured. Sometimes I can walk away from a shoot feeling quite exposed, but yet quite exhilarated as it gives the viewer an incredible insight into myself.

In thinking of the camera as a partner or lover, I hopefully transfer all of my emotions, my hopes, dreams, my sexuality reflecting that I'm proud of my body, I'm proud to be a strong woman, and it doesn't matter what I went through to get to this point, because what everyone sees now is me. This is who I am and proud to be so.

I want people to see the connection that I have with the artists vision, to wonder what was said to bring such emotion out. It's a demanding role but such a meaningful one, I look forward to working with fellow association members in the future.

Featured Interview The passion that is Argentini

It took me several years, about ten, to complete this project and to find all these locations. I wanted to mix very beautiful interiors, private residences and hotels, with more "trashy" places like the motels that you can rent just for a few hours to have sex. I believe I was able to achieve my goal and to have a very interesting mix of very different looking locations.

I try always to do all the styling for all my "personal" work and to coordinate it with the type of model and location I'm shooting. I try to have a storyboard before I go on location but, most of the time is the "magic" that happens on the set than makes the best shots of the day.

I try to suggest the models some of the positions and the expressions but, once again, you can't never predict what is going to happen on the set. The feeling you can create with the model on the set is more important than any storyboard you may prepare before you get to the location.

Sculpture is the form of art I love the most. In my first book, SILVEREYE I tried shooting the models in a very "sculptural" way, putting an accent on their bodies and hiding on purpose their faces. In this new project, the body is still important off course, but the face and the expression of the models becomes the most important aspect of the image.



Color and black and white is a choice I used to make on location, depending on the colors of the location itself and the feeling I was getting at the moment. Now, most of the times, I shoot all in color and convert into B/W later on the images I like to see in B/W.

My team consists, for my "personal" work, as the one you see in my two books, 99% of the times on just the model and me.

The physical amount of work is very hard but the feeling you get with the model having the energy going in the room just between me and her, is worth the hard work.

I love to mix the available light in the room, natural or coming from the artificial light in the room, with either flash or tungsten light. I do not have one light source that I prefer. As you can see from the book, the lighting changes every time.

I work most of the times with 6x6 Hasselblad because I love the composition in a square format and the quality of the Zeiss lenses. I have never shot digital up to today but I will start soon to explore this media. No preferences for film, always color negatives. I love to use the normal lens and wide angles lenses.





I love to find new and more "unusual" angles for the cameras to make the image "different and unusual". I love shooting from the ground up and from above. I believe I was able to keep the positions of the model "not too explicit". My goal was to walk on the very fine line of "eroticism", between pornography on one side and very banal images with no strength on the other side. Not all my models are "fashion models". Some are just friends that liked to work with me and were not "professional models".

The photographs in this book are part of an absolutely new personal quest based on my great love for sculpture and dance, which lasted from 1984 to 1996 and which I financed entirely on my own. I was heavily influenced by the art of Constantin Brancusi, whose primeval sculptures of polished bronze made me aware of the fascination of the absolute.



Henri Cartier-Bresson formulated some years ago: "Just what is absolutely new supposed to mean? Every photo is virginal to someone who has never seen it before. It is the surprise, the freshness of the image. Apart from that, who, on meeting a fascinating person for the first time, would think of asking him or her whether he or she is still a virgin?" Some photographs of nudes have been so heavily retouched by computer that the bodies look as though they are made of plastic. Do I insult anyone by saying that some photographers just betray their lack of self-confidence that way? My understanding of the quest for perfection is not the battle against scars or other blemishes, which is conducted with such vehemence that it annihilates the energy contained in the picture. For me, perfection is truth and vitality.


Every form of art—whether it manifests itself in a painting, a sculpture, a poem, or a photograph—is always interpreted according to the personal sensitivity and culture of the viewer.

My message—if anyone cares to look for a message in my photographs at all—does not in any way seek to exert force or compulsion, but only to arouse emotions. Nude photography is a difficult subject, probably the most difficult of all, but for this very reason also the most stimulating—it is a continual challenge. It is a walk on a tight-rope requiring a steady gait, for it entails the risk of plummeting into pornography on the one hand or plunging into banality on the other hand.

SilverEye deals with eroticism, the look is most significant, but in the present case, sensuality is transferred to the body. That is why the model's face is almost never visible, and when it is, the eyes never look into the camera. The women I portray more than reflecting the traditional aesthetic values that the world of fashion is so concerned with, but to a far greater extent, represent the abstraction of beauty. The energy that flows between me and my model is stronger and more intense when I am alone with the her. The personal relationship that develops between the photographer and the model is of decisive importance and the basis of the final result. And because that is so, I am prepared to wait a long time until I find the right subject for a particular idea. I have seen how strongly the model's attitude depends on the personality of the photographer and on the type of attraction that unfolds between the two, and that there is an interdependence that necessarily has to do with sexuality. Just think of Newton's and Rheims' photographs compare with those of Ritts and Weber.

Photography is often presumed to have the utopian function of stopping time and in some way or other preserving beauty forever, but nothing really dies in life; everything lives on, only form changes. The fear of losing beauty or one's life, the fear of having to leave everything behind—these fears seize us only because we don't succeed in making the most of the present. I am often asked whether photography can convey a spiritual message.

I believe that man is always alone in his relationship with the infinite, and that there are things one cannot communicate. certain signals can only be received and deciphered by those who are sufficiently sensitive; the rest of our earthly existence is just an everyday game. Instead of the portrait that usually accompanies biographies, I prefer a picture that was taken at the beach some years ago and shows me together with my father and my grandfather. I dedicate this book to both of them, for it is their look that will accompany me throughout my entire life, and I am thankful to them for having believed in me all these years.

In this age of high tech equipment many artists see the vignetting, light leaks, uneven focal planes, poor quality lens design, low pixel count etc not as faults but as the aesthetic potential of these 'tools' and Christopher has long been seduced by the style of imagery that can be obtained by using such 'cameras'.


